I. Who we are?

Established in 1988, Ailola Quito is a leading Spanish language school in Ecuador designed especially for the needs of foreign students. - 2004** – The Spanish school in Ecuador becomes recognized by the national government an Educative Foundation, an important recognition that allows it to expand farther across Ecuador
- 2006** – Ailola Quito begins a partnership with an animal rescue center in the Amazon and an orphan and abandoned children's organization to help out and offer more volunteer places to students
- 2008** – The school is recognized by the AECEE – the Association of Spanish Schools in Ecuador
- 2011** – Ailola Quito's Traveling Classroom extends across to the Galapagos Islands, with the "Secret of Evolution" itinerary
- 2013** – School moved to new building in the historic city center of Quito

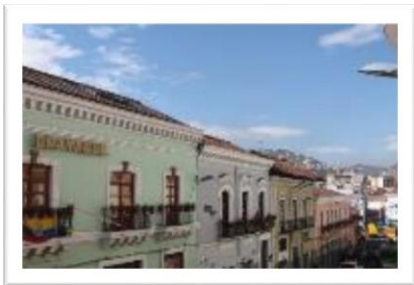

- Ride the *telefériQo* – Quito's swank new sky tram will take you 1.5 miles into the sky past Pinchincha Volcano to Cruz Loma, where you'll overlook Quito.
- Eat like a local – We won't insist on making you try *cuy* (grilled guinea pig), but tasting other mouth-watering local dishes is a must!
- Dance in La Mariscal – Aside from coming to us Monday to Friday to study Spanish, you'll likely want to go out and have fun, Ecuadorian-style.

- Snorkel, dive, swim! Darwin and Wolf Islands in the Galapagos archipelago are considered some of the best diving destinations on earth, with a breathtaking array of clear and well-preserved sites for divers.
- Lend a helping hand. Attention scientists, researchers, and all the average Joes of the world! For decades now, people from across the world have come to Ecuador, not just for the chance to learn Spanish on the Galapagos Islands, but to lend a helping hand in efforts to protect on of the world's most pristine natural environment.

- Rub for good luck – Locals believe the *lechero* tree on the outskirts of Otavalo contains magical healing powers.
- Visit a local textile factory – The decision to study Spanish in Otavalo means you'll get an insight into the workings of one of Ecuador's most successful entrepreneurial communities.
- Test the taste spuds – The Food Market in Otavalo is where you can put your money where your mouth is. While you won't spend much, we're certain you'll need to try new, delicious and traditional flavors, in a town where the large indigenous community serves itself just as much as the tourists that pass through.
- Witness living traditions – A short walk from Otavalo's town center is Peguche Waterfall, a popular natural attraction that acts as the site of an important traditional cleansing ceremony

Want to immerse yourself in indigenous culture in Ecuador? At Ailola Quito we work with over 25 indigenous host families on the outskirts of Otavalo, offering students the chance to live and learn Spanish alongside a traditional Otavaeño community.

Location

Just two hours from Quito, in the heart of Ecuador, Otavalo is hard to miss! We'll be heading a little farther afield than the town itself, where you'll find a whole other side to Otavalo.

- Learn about traditional Otavaeño life. Whether its organic gardening, cooking, local history or spiritual customs, the chance to study Spanish alongside an Otavaeño family is all about learning!
- Visit the craft and food markets with your family. Many see Otavalo's success in the town's indigenous craft market.
- Visit the *lechero* tree. On the outskirts of Otavalo, the mystical *lechero* tree awaits you! Locals around here consider the tree to hold magical healing powers, which pass through you when you rub its bark.
- Merge nature with tradition. An absolute must when you visit the Otavalo region, is the hike to the 60-foot high Peguche falls.
- Venture farther afield. Otavalo is one of the premiere tourist and adventure hotspots in the Sierra region of Ecuador. While you're here, make the most of the world around you! Beautiful Lake Cuicocha is not far away and don't forget to check out the quaint towns of Cotacachi and Machachi, plus captivating Cotapaxi National Park!

- Milk the cows. While no one will force you – especially not the cows – students who choose to study Spanish on the *hacienda* will have the opportunity to milk the cows on the property.
- Taste local flavors. It's not a real *hacienda* if it doesn't produce food to eat!
- Practice Spanish with farmers. Unlike other language courses, this opportunity to learn Spanish on a *hacienda* provides you real and instant experiences with the Spanish language.
- Experience the world around you. The *hacienda* is just one hour from Quito and another hour from Otavalo. However, not far from the *hacienda* you'll also find a world of travel opportunities, including pristine natural sites, quaint villages and loads of friendly locals to practice your Spanish with!

Learn Spanish in Shuar Community

Once famous for practicing head shrinking on their dead enemies, today the Shuar community of the Amazon kindly invites you to stay a while. The chance to learn Spanish in a Shuar community, deep within the Amazon jungle, won't be the same as learning Spanish in a 5-star resort by the beach, or at a modern language school in the city. Nonetheless, the Shuar community we work with in the Amazon guarantees an authentic and warm stay.

Location

Much of the Amazon's charm has to do with its isolation. Which is why – to make things simpler for you – we'll send your teacher along for the ride. Together you'll travel to Paltaza province in Ecuador's *Oriente* or Amazon region, where the host Shuar community awaits you. *How?*

- Jungle journeys. There is the chance to venture deep into the Amazon jungle, where a local guide will share survival secrets and a whole lot about Shuar history!
- Visit the nearby waterfall. Not too far from your new home in jungle, a special waterfall awaits you. It's here where members of the local community come to draw energy from Mother Nature.
- Learn about traditional medicine and tobacco use. On your outings to the forest, you'll have a chance to plant medicinal plant species and learn more about local forms of medicine.
- Optional volunteering experiences. While our Shuar community program is ultimately a Spanish language program, students should feel free to participate in local volunteer opportunities if they want to.
- Experience local dance and music. On your final night in the Shuar community, the locals will light a bonfire and introduce you to traditional dance and music customs.
